Dear Friends,

It has been a week of weeks as we have celebrated with three schools in the church for their Carol concerts. What a joy it has been to hear the children of all ages singing their carols, and also listening to the readings. The pupils have behaved impeccably in the church, coming from Mandeville Primary, Reedings and our own church school in Spellbrook. Earlier in the year I gave a mini church tour to some of the pupils at Reedings and was pleasantly surprised to learn how informed they were of certain monuments and brasses in the church. There will



always be a welcome to any of the schools who wish to visit Great St Mary's with its wonderful history and artefacts for all to see.

On Sunday we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Advent, where we hear readings from Micah and also St. Luke. We shall also be welcoming the Bishop of Hertford as our celebrant at the 9.30am Eucharist.

From our readings, we learn about Mary and Elizabeth both expecting a baby. Mary visits Elizabeth and the baby in Elizabeth's womb leapt for joy as it recognises the Saviour of the world. Never before had God come among his people so closely. Mary and Elizabeth had been chosen by God to bring into the world our Saviour but also John the Baptist, the forerunner of Jesus. Our reading from the gospel of Luke gives us Mary's wonderful words of the Magnificat.

As we draw closer to Christmas, we may like to offer a prayer: 'Lord help us to be like Mary, to be humble and obedient to your will. Help us to see your presence in our daily lives. May we recognise and welcome you in every moment'.

On Sunday evening we celebrate with our Carol Service, where we have the opportunity to sing carols, hear the Christmas message and listen to our Choir singing a number of anthems.

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY

Micah 5:2-5a:

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labour has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel. And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth; and he shall be the one of peace. If the Assyrians come into our land and tread upon our soil, we will raise against them seven shepherds and eight installed as rulers.

Psalm 80:1-8:

To the leader: on Lilies, a Covenant. Of Asaph. A Psalm. Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock! You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh. Stir up your might, and come to save us! Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved. O Lord God of hosts, how long will you be angry with your people's prayers? You have fed them with the bread of tears, and given them tears to drink in full measure. You make us the scorn of our neighbours; our enemies laugh among themselves. Restore us, O God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved. You brought a vine out of Egypt; you drove out the nations and planted it.

Luke 1:39-45 (46-55):

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.' And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

He has brought down the powerful from their thrones,

and lifted up the lowly;

he has filled the hungry with good things,

and sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel,

in remembrance of his mercy,

according to the promise he made to our ancestors,

to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'

READINGS FOR CHRISTMAS MORNING – 9.30am:

Isaiah 9:2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;
those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined.
You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy;
they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder.
For the yoke of their burden,

and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onwards and for evermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

Psalm 96

O sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvellous works among all the peoples. For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; he is to be revered above all gods. He it is who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered.

This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria.

All went to their own towns to be registered.

Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea,

to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.

While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child.

And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth,

and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields,

keeping watch over their flock by night.

Then an angel of the Lord stood before them,

and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them,

'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy

for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour,

who is the Messiah, the Lord.

This will be a sign for you:

you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.'

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host,

praising God and saying,

'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!'

1 Samuel 2:18-20 & 26

Samuel was ministering before the Lord, a boy wearing a linen ephod.

His mother used to make for him a little robe and take it to him each year,

when she went up with her husband to offer the yearly sacrifice.

Then Eli would bless Elkanah and his wife, and say,

'May the Lord repay you with children by this woman for the gift that she made to the Lord'; and then they would return to their home.

Now the boy Samuel continued to grow both in stature and in favour with the Lord and with the people.

He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me?

Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?'

But they did not understand what he said to them.

Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them.

His mother treasured all these things in her heart.

And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea,

wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking,

'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews?

For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.'

When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him;

and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people,

he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born.

They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

"And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." '

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying,

'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him,

bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.'

When they had heard the king, they set out; and there,

ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage.

Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod,

they left for their own country by another road.
